

SEVERE WEATHER DAY ALERT

WATCH

Stay Alert and Be Prepared!

- Know your safest shelter point & be sure it is clear and prepared. Know the names of the counties around you.
- Let someone outside your home know where you'll be
- Have a go bag ready with medicines, water, food, flashlight, a whistle, important documents
- Check on others. Make sure they're aware, especially elderly/ disabled/ vulnerable
- If you live in a mobile, manufactured, or unstable home, go to a friend's house or a shelter
- Offer shelter to those in mobile homes/ weaker structures
- Have MULTIPLE ways to receive warnings, including a weather radio with S.A.M.E. technology
- Know your local National Weather Service office and follow them for information
- Check for updates from your local meteorologist
- Make sure your phone/devices and battery chargers are fully charged

WARNING

Act fast and Follow Advisories!

- Get in your storm shelter or the most interior part of your home away from windows and doors with the most walls between you and outside as possible. Don't forget pets!
- Wear a helmet or have some way to protect your head
- Put on sturdy, closed toe shoes and have your keys/ wallet
- Place babies in car seats
- Take your weather radio/ phone/ tablet with you for updates
- Listen to your local meteorologist & weather alert network for updates
- If you are camping in an RV, go to the nearest sturdy structure at the campground such as the restrooms
- If you are in a vehicle, DO NOT shelter under an overpass. Go to your nearest structure or get out of your vehicle, lay flat in a ditch, & cover your head
- Your life is not worth a picture for social media. Wait until after the threat has passed
- Check on your family, friends, and neighbors after the threat has passed to see if they need help
